



VOLUNTEER DEPUTY REGISTRAR

WHAT ARE THE QUALIFICATIONS?

To be appointed a Volunteer registrar, a person must:

1. Be at least 18 years old;
2. Be a United States citizen;
3. Not have been determined by a final judgment of court exercising probate jurisdiction to be:
 - a. Totally mentally incapacitated; or
 - b. Partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote;
4. Not have been finally convicted of a felony, or, if convicted must have:
 - a. Fully discharged the sentence, including any term of incarceration, parole, or supervision; or
 - b. Been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disability to vote;
5. Not have been finally convicted of identity theft under Section 32.51 of the Penal Code; and
6. Be a Texas resident.

WHAT ARE THE DUTIES OF A VOLUNTEER DEPUTY REGISTRAR?

A Volunteer Deputy Registrar may distribute and accept a voter registration application form from any resident of Bee County; and distribute and accept applications from voters who wish to change or correct information on his/her voter registration certificate.

WHAT IS THE LENGTH OF APPOINTMENT?

You may be appointed at any time according to scheduled training dates. Volunteer Deputy Registrar's appointments expire on December 31 of every even numbered year.

WHEN AND WHERE ARE VDR TRAINING CLASSES OFFERED?

VDR classes are offered the 2nd Tuesday of the month at 10:00 a.m. in the Bee County Elections Administration Office, 107 S. St. Mary's St. Beeville, TX
